- Win7 Start -> Control Panel -> Power Options
- Win8 First find the Control Panel...
- Ubuntu Linux -> System Settings -> Power

Control Panel Power Options

What can it do?

- Allows you to completely ignore when to shut the PC off
- Save electricity. Yeah!
- Set what happens when the Power Button is pressed or Laptop Lid is closed

Here's What I do...

- I use "Sleep Mode" exclusively (more on Hibernation later...)
- Sleep when "Closing of the Laptop Lid"
- Dim the screen quicker when on battery
- Power button puts the system to sleep
- Let the system sleep after 45 min of inactivity

Sleep Mode vs Hibernation

Very different Options

Sleep Mode - PC is still on (but barely)

Hibernation - PC is fully powered down

Sleep Mode

- Perfect if the PC is plugged in
- Uses trickle of power to keep memory "alive"
 - Monitor dims
 - Hard drive spins down
 - Network shuts off
- Comes to life in a few seconds
- Sleep mode will eventually drain the battery
- Not a substitute for Start -> Shutdown

Hibernation

- Makes a "copy" of the PC memory and saves it to disk
- PC Powers down when finished
- I have found it to be "finicky" and buggy
- Much longer shutdown & restart time
- Perfect if you like your PC windows the way they are and you travel long distances

Dimming the Display

- #1 Electricity Saver
- Make it dim quicker when on battery
- Probably makes the laptop and/or destop monitor last longer
- Everyone should be doing this already

Going to Sleep

- The amount of idle time prior to going to sleep is up to you.
- Less idle time when on battery
- Longer when plugged in

Ex: If you read your email once a day and it takes an hour.

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Miscellaneous

WinXP/Vista/7 have nameable profiles.
Which are useless...

 Hibernation is sorta dependent on the maker of the PC. Dell, HP, Acer, etc...
So... Hibernation may have to be enabled with its own Control Panel setup
