What is Facebook (FB)?


- Software program running at facebook.com
 and tablets and smartphones
- Started in 2004 primarily between students at Ivy League universities
- VERY, VERY smart people run Facebook
- The movie "The Social Network" tells the story


What is FB?

- Size, color and fonts


If something is weird or hard then it's that way on purpose and you should take note.

The one thing you should remember


The **Newsfeed Page** will show you all of the pictures and comments that your "friends" will share to FB

And you MUST be logged in to see it.


FB Newsfeed Page




FB Newsfeed Page




Your FB "Home" Page

FB "Friends" Hierarchy



FB Communication Expansion

You + Friends + Their Friends

The amount of people that can potentially see what you share is HUGE

Example:

Say my daughter has 954 "friends" and each of them have 500. That's 477 thousand possible connections! OMG!!!!

FB Sharing

You can "share" what you have direct control over

- Text you type in your "status"
- Pictures you upload
 - pictures will be resized automatically
 - picture location via smartphone GPS is also included in the photo

FB Sharing

You can share other peoples stuff

Friend's Newsfeed items on your Newsfeed

- Any website with: f Share on Facebook
- Any website with a Like

Time permitting info on the Heartbleed Bug

Limiting What You See or "Curating" Your Newsfeed

Click or mouse-over the Friend Name or down arrow in top right corner

Choose the option that suits you needs Block/Unfriend/Unfollow

Unfriend vs Unfollow

Unfriend undoes the FB connection

- there is no notification
- Unfollow removes the friends posts from your Newsfeed
- this is probably what you want
- they can still see your posts

Telling FB what you don't want to see

Click on the down arrow at the top right of any post

- good for easing yourself out of Gene Armacher's political posts

Your Profile

REMEMBER

The more profile information you give FB the better they can target ads to you & your friends

REMEMBER

You don't need to give FB ANY profile info

Controlling Profile Access

Every profile item has a Public/Friends Only/Me Only toggle.

Make sure you look at each item regularly

- FB sometimes changes stuff on their own

Things you might want in your profile

The High School and College you attended Places that you worked Churches you belonged to And make that stuff **Public**

But only if you are interested in old friends finding you

Dangers of Oversharing

Learn how to make a profile item Public/Friends Only/Only Me

Only Me means no one else but includes FB

- for ad profiling purposes

What Bad Guys Can Do

Connect to you by impersonating a friend by copying some public pictures and changing their name *slightly*.

Then they lurk on your account and learn all about you.

What can bad guys do?

Gain access to all YOUR friends
Spam them with bad web sites
Know when you are home or not
- especially bad for seasonal people

The HeartBleed Bug

The majority of secure websites use a software library called OpenSSL to do the https://encryption

For two years this had a bug that allowed hackers to see your encrypted data & worse

HeartBleed Bug

Who had the bug?

Google, Yahoo, Pinterest, Netflix and 1000's of other sites

Not PayPal, Amazon or MAJOR US Banks

What to Do?

All sites have been patched and fixed

But you should really change your password. Sigh...

I did and I also turned on 2-factor Authentication
