What is a cookie?

A cookie is a small file* that a website sends back to your browser for saving.

This has been part of the HTTP (browser/server) communication standard since Netscape invented it at the beginning of time**

* less than 4,000 bytes

** or about 1994



Example Cookie File

Browsers will either store a cookie as a single file or as a row in a private database in the browser configuration area. This is usually hidden and hard to find.

Example cookie file name: bankofamerica.com.txt Inside the cookie file

```
name=hanmade@gmail.com

^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^ this is the bank's saved user id

NOT the password.
```

Third Party or *Tracking Cookies*

- 1. You go on amazon.com and search for "lifesized-blowup dolls"
- 2. Amazon creates a unique ID and sets a cookie on your browser
- 3. Amazon also sets a cookie for admanager.com with that ID
- 4. You go to yahoo.com which also sends the admanager.com cookie (with your unique Amazon ID) back to Admanager.com.
- 5. Now Admanager.com knows you've been to Amazon *and* Yahoo.
- 6. Yahoo now knows what you shopped for at Amazon and it displays an ad for "Cheap Blowup Dolls" on the right side of the screen.

Creepy Yes?
